3	<p>Proposal to change the roles of Sabbatical Officers</p> <p>Fina outlined the proposal for the changes to officer roles. Currently there are four roles, with an Exeter President, a Falmouth President and two VPs. This isn't representative as it often ends up with more presidents being from one university compared to the other. The proposal would be that there is an Exeter President, an Exeter VP, a Falmouth President and an Exeter VP.
